Arkansas Police Chiefs to Participate in Executive Management Course in Little Rock

August 29, 2008, Little Rock, Arkansas—Through the cooperative efforts of the Arkansas Association of Chiefs of Police (AACP) and the Criminal Justice Institute (CJI), twenty-two police chief executives from across the State will meet in Little Rock to participate in the sixth annual *Police Chief Executive Development Course*, a three-day management seminar designed exclusively for Arkansas police chiefs. This seminar will focus on topics that are critical to the successful management of Arkansas law enforcement agencies, including leadership, media relations, and internal investigations.

Jim Clark, Director of the Criminal Justice Institute, is delighted this event will be held at the Institute, an organization that specializes in advanced law enforcement education, training, and professional development. “This seminar provides a higher level of executive training and education to Arkansas police executives while also allowing law enforcement managers from across the State to come together and discuss the unique issues that affect each of their agencies.
