

Drug Evaluation and Classification Program Arkansas Drug Recognition Expert Instructor Application Process

Thank you for your interest in becoming a DRE Instructor. Every year in Arkansas over 100 people die in alcohol/drug related crashes. The role of training new DREs and recertifying existing DREs is critical in Arkansas's fight to reduce alcohol/drug related fatalities and injuries.

That is why the process to select new DRE instructors is stringent and requires a commitment from both the potential instructor and his/her agency head. Before you make your decision, please consider your desire to take on this role, as well as discussing, with your agency Chief/Sheriff, the time commitment that will be required.

If you do not have a strong desire to participate in this program or your agency cannot make a time commitment for you to participate, please do not submit an application. Likewise, if you do have a strong desire to participate and your agency is prepared to allow your participation as required, we welcome you into the Instructor Candidate training program and look forward to your support and involvement in the program. It should be noted that due to class size, the needs of the State, and budget constraints, not all applications are accepted.

The following items will be required to be submitted with your application:

- Completed DRE Instructor Application
- Signed DRE Instructor Commitment Pledge
- Updated Vitae
- One page cover letter explaining your reasons for wanting to be a DRE instructor and why you feel you are qualified
- Copy of your Instructor Development Certification
- Copy of your SFST Instructor Development Certification
- Copy of your ARIDE (Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement) certificate
- Copies of other instructor certifications you might possess
- Copies of your two most recent DRE evaluation reports
- Copy of your current, up to date rolling log
- Letter of recommendation from your chief/sheriff
- Letter of recommendation from a current DRE instructor in good standing (recommended, but not required)
